

Uluru Holiday

During our unit on timetables you have learnt how to read and interpret a range of timetables, calculate elapsed time and have been introduced to Australian time zones.

Your Task: Plan a mini holiday to Uluru, Northern Territory for one adult and one child. Your date of travel is Monday 12th November 2012 - Friday 16th November 2012. One day of this holiday must include a visit to Ayers Rock.

Trip details

- People on the trip = you and one adult
- Cost of trip = must not exceed \$5000
- Itinerary must include:
 - transport
 - tourist attractions
 - costing for flights, attractions and accommodation.

You must consider:

- what modes of transport you will use
- where you will stay
- what you will do
- how much it will cost

You must include times, transportation and cost from the moment you leave home until the moment you arrive back home. You must use timetables on the internet to plan these various elements of your trip.

For this trip you will have a budget of \$5000. This requires you to investigate the best price of tickets, travel modes and accommodation so you stick to your budget.

You must complete this task individually and reference your work through a website link or flight number.
